
PROSPECTUS



COURSES OFFERED

ORIENTATION

All new students are expected to attend the Orientation Ceremony which is usually held on 8th July every year. This is the day that Wilsonia was founded in 1966. The Orientation is a special ceremony when the new students are inducted into the Wilsonia family with a word of prayer and are introduced to the college and its faculty and management. Orientation becomes the event when the foundation of your college life at Wilsonia is laid.



Attendance & Internal Assessment

The University lays down that a minimum of 75% attendance in all lectures is compulsory to appear in the University Examination. The college functions 6 days a week. A proper time table of lectures is followed and adhered to. Once students are on campus, they must take formal permission from the Principal or office staff before leaving the campus.

Internal Assessment Examinations are conducted once a year, before the University Examination. This provides the students an incite of how exams are conducted and becomes a trial run before the Examinations.

Appearing in the Pre-University Examination is compulsory. A fine is charged for absence in examinations. In case of very pressing circumstances, prior permission through a formal application may be sought, it is however the management's discretion to entertain such an application.

Discipline

As a place of learning Wilsonia Degree College has a code of conduct which every student is expected to follow. A complete list of Rules and Regulations is given to every student at the time of Admission and the student has to sign an undertaking to abide by these rules while in college, Rudeness with Staff and Management is intolerable and must be avoided at all costs.

- Accepting Exams: CBSE 12th, UP 12th, ISC, CUET
- Reservations for SC/ST/OBC candidates will be made as per University Regulations.

- ▶ At the time of registration the candidates will be required to submit all credentials along with the registration form. On basis of these credentials, candidates will be short listed for the interview.
- ► The candidates who successfully clears the interview will be offered admission and will be allowed a week to complete all admission formalities.
- ► A selected candidate must agree to adhere to the Rules and Regulations of the College by signing an acceptance certificate.

Important Note

- 1- Students cannot change course once enrolled. That is once they have been offered admission to a particular course.
- 2- Students must submit Admission form with all papers only then will the College Identity Card be issued and will students be allowed to attend classes.
- 3- Late fine will be charged if fees is paid after due date. Also late fine will be charged for Library books not returned or re-issued on time.
- 4- All fees are non-transferable and non-refundable.
